

Flow Flow Feed Re-connect

This guide is if you need to re-connect your facebook feed through the website. We cannot do this as only the owner of the Facebook page can connect it.

To do so, you will need to login on the backend of the website via a link that looks like the one below;

Once you've logged in, you will be directed to the website's dashboard, as shown below;

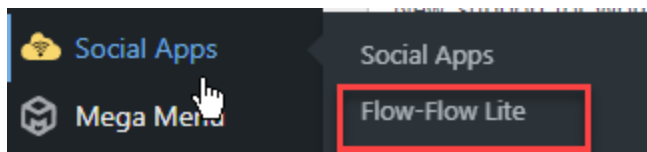

If you scroll down this page, you will see on the left-hand side menu, there's a "Social Apps" option, as shown below;

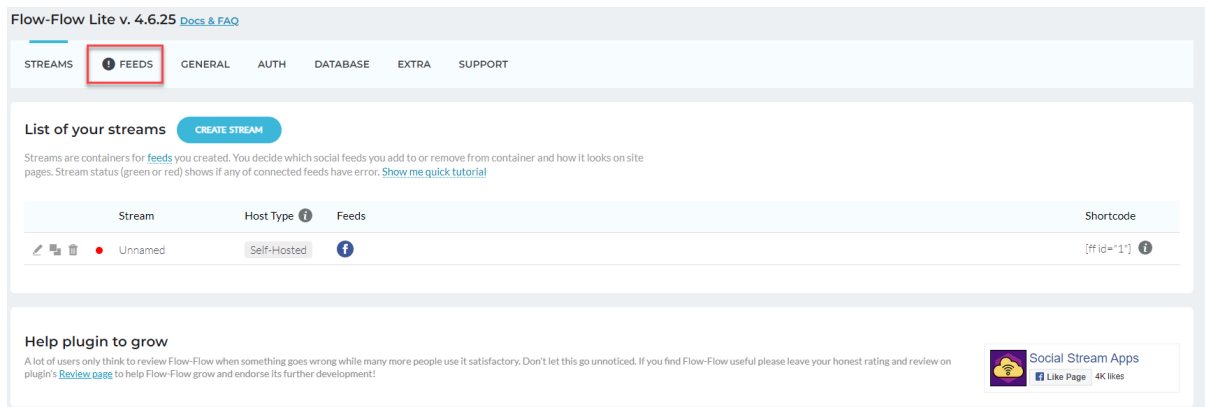

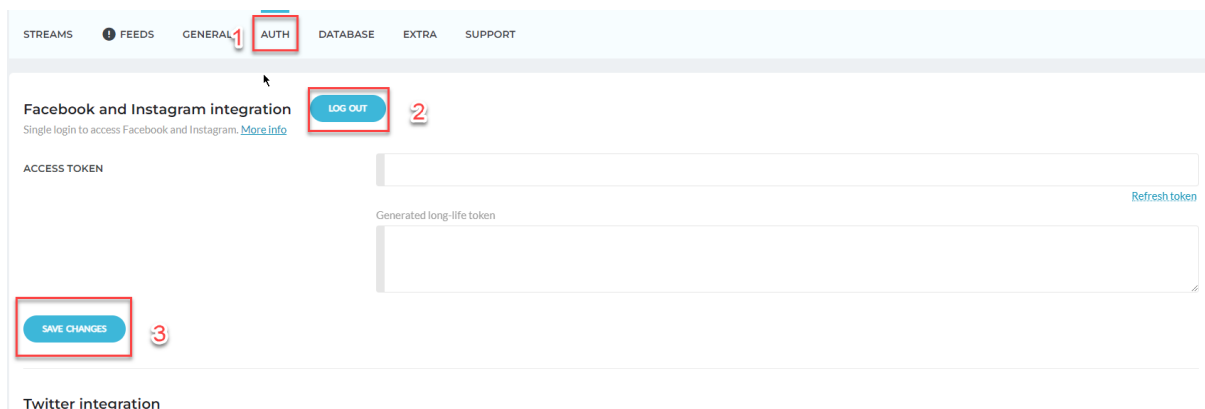
Hover over it with your mouse, and then click on Flow Flow;



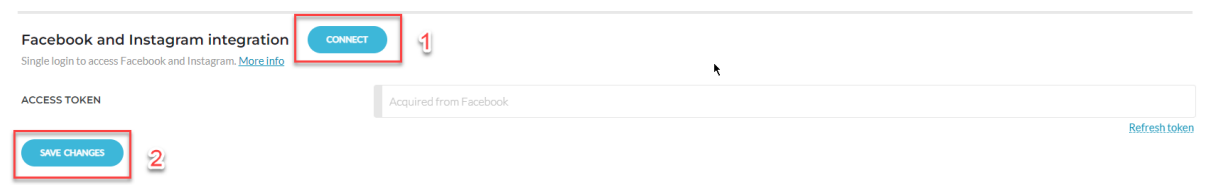
Once clicked, the page should look like this, and you'll notice there's an exclamation point next to "FEEDS";



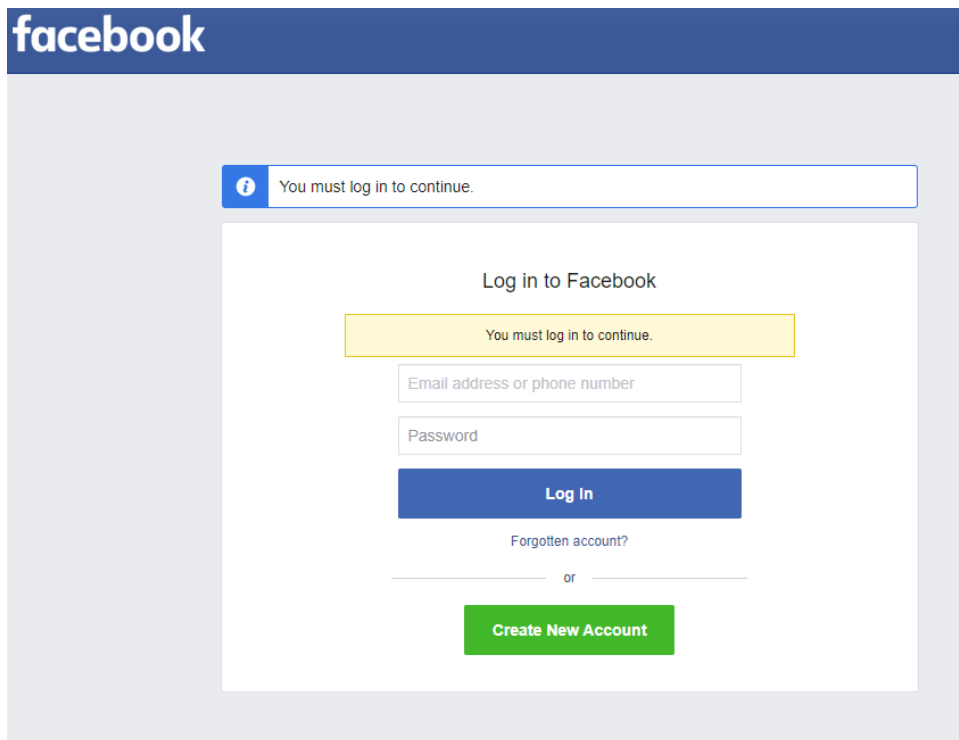
The easiest way to resolve this, is to click on "AUTH" tab, "LOG OUT", "SAVE CHANGES", and re-connect your Facebook account, as shown below;



Once you've unlinked Facebook, you now have to re-link it;



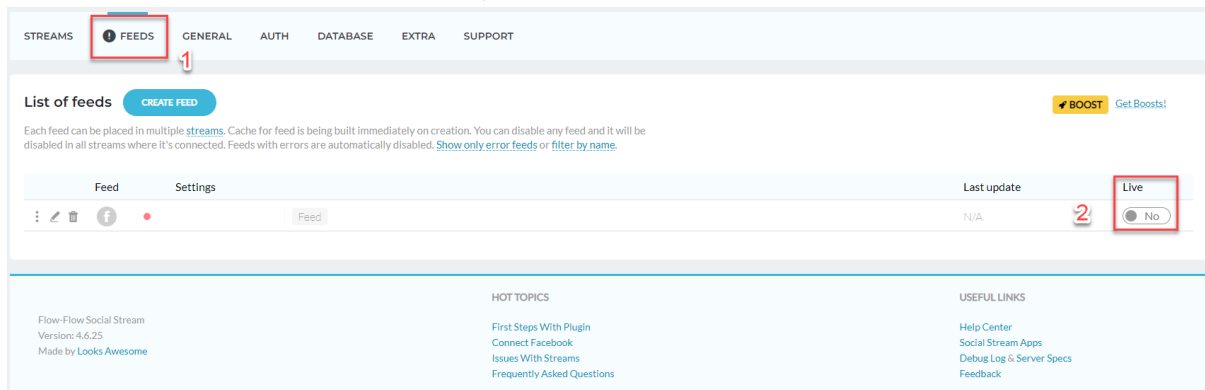
Click on “CONNECT”, which will redirect you to facebook, and follow the steps;



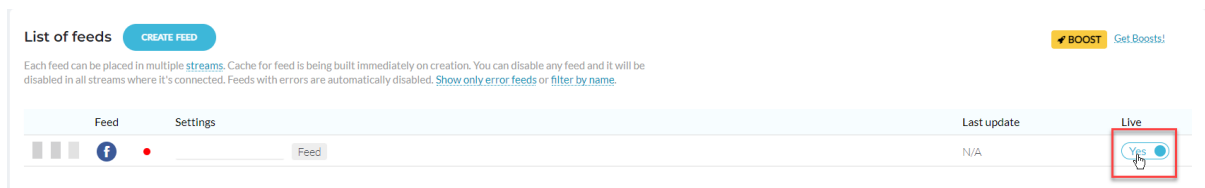
Once you’re finished with the authentication steps, you will be automatically re-directed back to the Flow Flow page, where you will need to save your settings, by clicking “SAVE CHANGES”.

Your account should now be linked again, as a final check, we will need to make sure your feed is enabled again.

Click on “FEEDS” and make sure it is live;



If it says “No” under Live, click it, and let it verify, it should then change to “Yes”;

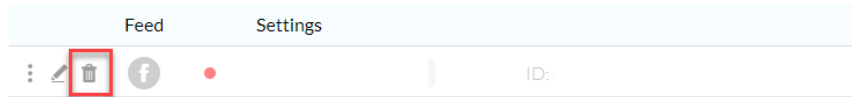


If the Feed isn't working, bin it, and create a new one, as shown below;

CREATE FEED

Each feed can be placed in multiple [streams](#). Cache for feed is being built immediately on creation. You can disable disabled in all streams where it's connected. Feeds with errors are automatically disabled. [Show only error feeds](#) o



Then create a new feed, by clicking on "CREATE FEED".

Choose "Page with restrictions" under feed type, leave content to show blank, and the rest is personal preference;

NOTE: "Boost this feed" isn't free, so we suggest leaving it off.

That's it – your Facebook is now linked & live with your website.
